>>> FUNDS & STUFF

We know many people are struggling to house and feed themselves due to the rising costs of living. With the funding, previously mentioned, from Food Banks BC running low, we are facing the hard reality of having to raise our meal prices. As we do not want any seniors going hungry or to cause any hardships, we continue to pursue every avenue to keep bringing our clients the meals they need without raising the cost of our meals. Behind the scenes, Amy, our Grant & Marketing Manager, has applied for several grants to cover various operational costs so that we are able to focus on our clients and their needs. All charities struggle with finances and

deficits and our charity is no different. Operating at a deficit means we are not financially stable but we will not give up on our mission to serve the vulnerable members of our community with proper nutrition. As you may know, White Rock Meals on Wheels was forced to

Meals on Wheels was forced to shut down last year due to rising operational costs. We are working towards expanding our service to the South Surrey and White Rock communities. With more municipal districts involved, we hope to receive more funding for our program. We will be renegotiating our contract with Fraser Health early next year and hope that they consider our rising food and operational costs.
